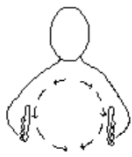
You can...

Try practising these signs...



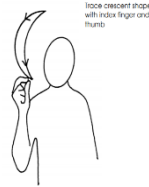
Space

Activities

Shaving Foam Marbled Earth (emerging)

You will need:

- Shaving foam
- Ready mix paint / food colouring
- Shallow tray (baking tray or disposable foil tray)
- Lolly stick or old pencil
- Paper plate / paper
- Plastic ruler



What to do:

1. Squirt a layer of shaving foam in a shallow tray.
2. Dribble paint or food colouring over the top.
3. Swirl paint around with a wooden skewer, old pencil or fingers.
4. Lay a paper plate over the top, smooth gently.
5. Lift the paper plate off and lay on a flat surface.
6. Scrape the foam off using a ruler, starting at one narrow end with the ruler upright, and a firm movement.
7. Leave marbled paper to dry.

Toilet Roll Rocket (mid)

You will need:

- Toilet roll
- Tin foil / coloured paper / paints (use whatever you can find to decorate it!)
- Cardboard or paper

What to do:

1. Cover your toilet roll - you can glue on coloured paper, wrap it in tin foil or paint it.
2. Cut a triangle out of paper or cardboard wider than the toilet paper roll. Cut two slits on the bottom of the toilet roll tube across from each other. Slide the triangle between these slits.
3. Cut a circle out of paper and roll this into a cone shape. Glue or sellotape it so it is secure. Glue or tape the paper cone onto the top of the rocket. This part is quite tricky so will need some patience!
4. Decorate your rocket with whatever you can find! I used leftover foil from Easter egg wrappers...

Paper Mache Planets (high)

You will need:

- **For the paper mache paste:** an old newspaper / magazine / white paper, 1 mug of plain flour, 1 mug of warm water, plus extra tap water
- Paintbrush
- Balloons
- Paint



What you do:

1. Blow up your balloons.
2. Make the paper mache mix:
 - Cut strips from newspaper or magazines.
 - Mix together the flour and warm water in a large bowl. Add a little tap water if the mixture is too stiff. The paste should be smooth and batter-like with no lumps. Add a pinch of salt to stop the paste from going mouldy.
3. Dip the newspaper strips into the paste, using the side of the bowl to get rid of any excess. Stick the strips to the balloon and use a paintbrush or your fingers to smooth down the paper. Repeat until fully covered.
4. Add more layers of newspaper strips (2-4 layers will make it strong). Using white paper for the final layer will make painting easier.
5. Leave the paper mache to dry.
6. Once dry, paint your planets - try painting a firey sun, a blue and green earth and a white moon.

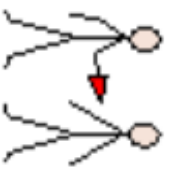
